President's Report to Sixth Annual General Meeting 17th August, 2017.



At the beginning of the year we were hoping to get another year added to our lease with the Department of Education or things were going to be very tough for us. Mayor Troy Pickard instigated discussion with the Minister for Education and was

instrumental in getting that extension till the end of 2019.

Thanks to all those involved in in granting us this extension.

We are moving forward slowly to achieve our aim of a new workshop by the end of 2019. Michael and I met with a planning group from the City of Joondalup who are putting together a business plan for us. We still haven't been given a site but are looking at the possible site being on MacDonald reserve. There are some issues to be researched before we will know of a final acceptable site. In the mean time we've spoken to Lotterywest who are sending out their guidelines for a grant application. The City requires us to have our funding in place by March 2018. This will need a site and lease details in place before we can apply for funding. The City of Joondalup staff has been very helpful and we look forward to working with them to get a workshop up and running.

Everyone we have talked to understands the enormous benefit the Men's Shed is to the growing number of retired men in the City. This number grows daily. We frequently get 2 or 3 new members each week. Currently we have 140 financial members with another 100 on our books, many of whom we expect to renew their membership. We had 240 members prior to June 30.

We rely on our members to be involved in the shed activities. Our survival is dependent on all members helping in some way. Thanks to all of you who have helped the shed in some way either at sausage sizzles, market stalls, making toys, repairing furniture or in the actual running of the shed.

The hardest worker in the shed is Michael and we thank him for his incredible ability to get things done. Last year I outlined all the things that Michael does. He has done even more this year. Michael is stepping down from the secretary's position and I will miss his ability and help. He is taking on the job of treasurer. Thank you Ron Slavin and Reg Luther for your help over the past year. Thank you Don Atkinson and Steve Thatcher for your work as Treasurer And Assistant Treasurer. Special thanks to those members who have helped out as Supervisors throughout the year. This is a very important part of our shed.

Michael will report on our finances. I would like to mention that we now have \$150 000 dollars in our building fund. This is an incredible achievement.

We were able to get a \$5000 grant from Local Projects Local Jobs. This will be used to upgrade some of our machines. We look forward to thanking Emily Hamilton for her help in getting this grant when she visited the shed on the 31st of August.

Unfortunately we have had to say a final farewell throughout the year to Ron Height Aug 2016, Chris Siney Oct 2016, Odd Fraroud Dec 2016, Trevor Davies Apr 2017 and Ralph Anthony in Aug 2017. They will be missed.

Thank you to Ian Goodenough for being our Patron and helping us to get the ball rolling to get our shed underway.

The last year has been successful and I hope we have provided a place where you our members can come and enjoy the company of other men.

Thank you for the support you have given me. I'm not the most talkative and after a life on the farm have trouble sitting down and relaxing in your company. I do enjoy your friendship.

As we move into our 7th year let us reflect on last year and aim to achieve better outcomes this year.


