The external training schedule of our supervisors has come with some criticism and reservations of the process. It is natural for individuals to express their reservations especially when it impacts on their comfort zone and way of doing things "their ways". But now that the process has started it is our duty to stay the course and see it successfully implemented. Our personal thanks to Mike Wiggins, of SGMS and previously of the MSWA, to provide invaluable help, advice and support towards our training and material for gaining compliance for our shed's operation.

During the training and assessment of our members certain deficiencies were brought to our notice on the safety and compliance issue of our operation and the machinery we use. The creditability of the assessor was questioned rather than look at the deficiencies. Our members deserve to have us address any deficiencies for the safety of the operators and adopt best known practices. Perhaps even to look at investing in machines, sooner than we had anticipated for our new premises, may be worth our consideration.

The City of Joondalup has presented us with a time schedule for achieving preconditions towards the

ultimate completion of our premises at Winton Road. We have completed our part of the first schedule and presented the City with our completed plans and are awaiting their acceptance and costing of the project to start our dialogue with Lottery West who require the costing as part of the filling the application for grant. In the recent meeting we are assured that the western power and the electric engineers of the city have done their due diligence and are in process of providing the electric power to the premises as part of their commitment. As you would have read the minutes of our preliminary meeting with Lottery West, we are in the process of collating information to start the application process in the very near future and we will seek help from external sources to help us to that end.

There have quite a few members who have fallen sick and are still unwell. I would like to thank John Summerfield and Chris Drury, who have gone beyond their call of welfare duties to attend to members who have sought their help.






