

RECYCLING ALUMINIUM CANS

The State Government will be introducing deposits on cans and plastic bottles later this year and there will be a return of ten cents per item on these containers at venues to be announced. This could be a good source of income for the shed. A receptacle has been installed in the social room. If you have any cans don't throw them in your council recycle

bin, bring them in and drop them at the shed. Even though the 10cents doesn't apply yet we can still get some income by selling them for scrap to a scrap metal dealer.



BBQ Trailer

An 8x5 Box trailer was purchased from PAPAS Trailers in Dec 2019 using grant money given to JMS by Ian Goodenough.

Because we had to show that we had used the grant fully for the trailer it was decided to have the trailer painted by a local Perth artist called Sioux, who after a few variations painted the front and sides with a cartoon representation of tools.

We also had a rear view camera fitted to both the ute and the trailer to facilitate hooking up and reversing.

We met with a woman from Joondalup council health dept. who came down to see how we had set the trailer up. She suggested that instead of only using the trailer as a temporary food van, we should make it a permanent food van. This entails having hot and cold water, a serving counter, Hand sanitizer, Fire extinguisher etc.

One of our members, David, is advising us on setting up the water and Graham Duffy is organising making a mobile sink unit.

We will purchase a new flat plate BBQ for future sausage sizzles.


