# Special General Meeting Tuesday May 21st, 2024 at 10:00 AM Joondalup Men's Shed 17 Winton Road Joondalup

We will be holding a Special general Meeting to amend the constitution with the following 4 resolutions:

- 1. Align the current constitution titles of Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson with JMS titles of President and Vice President.
- 2. Change the age of membership to 18 years or older, consistent with insurance coverage. Currently the constitution allows members to be under 18 (not covered by our insurance).
- 3. Per our Standard Operation Procedure, align membership fees to be paid within 1 month of the end of the fiscal year.
- 4. 4. Extend allowable committee membership for up to 4 years (from 2 years). We felt this is appropriate to ensure enough continuity of knowledge as we approach more multi-year shed projects. The more detailed "Form 5" we have to file detailing these changes, is attached. Refer to Section D for the specific language of the changes. If you are not planning to attend the standard proxy form is also attached. The proxy form must be submitted no later than 12:00 noon, Thursday May 16th. Please contact me if you have any questions.

### NOTES FROM THE APRIL COMMITTEE MEETING Rick Otero

- No Smoking We've had a few complaints about smoking at the shed including two written complaints. In reviewing the Joondalup City Regulations, we determined we must post signs at each "major" entrance to the shed. The committee agreed and is purchasing two additional signs to be installed one at the mid door entrance and one by the back entrance and will require adherence to the no smoking within 5 meters of the Shed. There is already a sign near the front entrance.
- 2. We will be implementing a new recognition approach in the coming quarter.
- 3. We are preparing for major grant submissions as the gaming trust opens a new round of grants in May.
- 4. We submitted a MSWA grant request for a talk on proactive health for members of the shed.
- 5. We sent a big thank you to Tyrepower for their donation of new truck tyres for the Dodge truck restoration project.
- 6. We were disappointed to report that one of the defibrillators is "missing in action".
- 7. We were reminded to remind the members of the shed that when they join, they sign a liability waiver. This was raised when another shed reported a "lack of understanding" about this during the MSWA North Perth regional meeting.
- 8. We had a decent 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter, generating \$21,700 in profit, which included the \$5000 MSWA grant to reimburse us for our purchase of new computers.
- 9. Our balance sheet is also healthy with total assets at about \$114,000.
- 10. There was discussion about establishing a monthly Shed budget. However, the committee felt that Graham and the supervisory team have been quite diligent about managing and reporting any necessary needs with appropriate financial controls. Additionally, we audited the "full separation" of the truck project spend from the Shed expense management and agreed that also was being managed appropriately.
- 11. We continue to grow Shed membership with 147 Men's Shed members and 30 Women's Shed associates

We established a timeline for the Annual General meeting (August 14<sup>th</sup>) as well as a special meeting to extend committee terms from 2 years maximum to 4 years maximum. The special general meeting will be held May 21<sup>st</sup>.
